Chestnut Health Services sites get \$2 million grant for COVID response

LOOMINGTON — Chestnut Health Systems will receive \$2 million in federal grants to expand behavioral health care services and help respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The grant is part of a \$14 million total given to four treatment proving the comments of the comments of the comment of the co

The Chestnut grant will be used in the agency's locations in Madison and St. Clair counties and allows Chestnut to serve an additional 1,165 clients over two years.

The grants, partially funded by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, will be used to increase access to **and to improve the quality** of community mental and substance use disorder (SUD) treatment services.

Chestnut will use the money for person-centered, team-based mental health services, substance use disorder treatment, and primary health care.

With the funding comes Chestnut's designation as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic. There are just two such clinics in Illinois and 113 in the U.S. CCBHCs provide person- and family-centered, integrated services including mental health treatment and substance use disorder treatment.

In addition to Chestnut, other providers receiving funding are Center Chestnut Health Services sites get \$25millioningra Illinois (Alton), Egyptian Health Department (Eldorado) and Robert Young Center (Moline), which are each receiving \$4 million.

Illinois reported a one-day record high in COVID-19 cases Tuesday and its next-to-highest death toll, just a d after Gov. J.B. Pritzker announced that the peak in coronavirus infections originally projected for late April has be pushed into mid-June.

The governor noted that the new cases reported — nearly 900 more than the previous high on May 1 — should come as no surprise given that the state received test results on more than 29,000 people in 24 hours, which is thousands more than in previous days. Testing availability, which continues to grow in Illinois, is key to tracking t disease and resuming a sidelined economy
